

The Sixties is a TV documentary series which was shown on CNN in 2014. Produced by Tom Hanks' studio Playtone, the 10-part series chronicled events and popular culture of the United States during the 1960s. It gives a nice overview of how 1950s American consensus was transformed and fractured which led to huge divisions in American society that still, arguably, are affecting America today.
