Dear Parents,

As we approach the end of I'm delighted to share our summer junior update with you. There has been so much going on our department over the past year and we would like to share some developments and memorable moments to celebrate the children's hard work.

A SECOND YEAR 3 CLASS!

We were delighted to be able to open our new Year 3 class in January. Having two classes in this year group means the children are taught in smaller sizes and allows more teacher and LSA time with individuals. Mrs Bisson and Mrs Lewis, the Year 3 form tutors, have been impressed with the children's progress and, *right*, you can see the children enjoying their learning in their brand-new bespoke classroom.



ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

We strive to ensure that every child at Blanchelande meets their full potential. Our rigorous curriculum, loosely based on the English National Curriculum, lays a secure foundation for senior school and beyond. We believe that the children should receive a knowledge-rich and joyful education, with opportunities to ask questions and discover new knowledge for themselves. This approach is facilitated by our Inquiry-Based Learning department and the combination of class teachers and subject specialists who make up the Junior department.

Reading (NGRT) Attainment May 2023

As advanced reading is essential for success, we place a great emphasis on developing children's reading and appreciation of literature. Our results in English and Maths speak for themselves. By Year 6 (the end of Key Stage 2), as shown in last year's reading attainment, the junior children have made excellent progress in their skills and knowledge. The level at which children are reading at a greater depth is significant and these advanced reading skills will enable the children to thrive as they move into the senior school and undertake GCSEs and A-Levels. For those children who need additional support in reading, our LSAs (learning support assistants) teach reading catch up sessions.

Writing and Grammar Attainment May 2023

The children's writing and understanding of grammar is judged against national expectations and in both counts our Year 6 children's attainment significantly exceeded the English national averages.

Maths Attainment May 2023

Year 6 children are taught by a maths specialist and are judged against national expectations for England. Children who excel in this subject are challenged and stretched within the curriculum. Those who need further support are involved in a bespoke intervention programmes. Again, our Year 6 children significantly surpass the national averages.

For the first time last year, Year 5 and 6 participated in the Mathematical Association Junior Maths Challenge, and achieved two gold, three silver and three bronze awards.



A WEALTH OF EXTRA-CURRICULAR **ACTIVITIES**

At Blanchelande, we strongly believe that there is more to school life than just the subjects in the classroom. Extra curricular activities (which are offered for free) run during lunchtimes and after school, and provide pupils will less formal opportunities to broaden their interests, skills and develop their social interactions. During the summer term we have 16 clubs for the children to choose from:

Lunchtime clubs also take the children outdoors: gardening club in the Eco Hut is particularly popular, especially when the flowers bloom.

As well as teaching Classics (Latin) within the junior curriculum from Year 4, Mrs Etheridge runs a lunchtime Ancient Greek Club (right) where children can immerse themselves in this ancient civilisation and its legacy.

Children of this age learning Latin helps them understand the origins of English (and the Romance languages) or to learn principles of grammar (which is how all languages operate). Aside from this, Latin has been proven to be an effective catalyst in raising attainment in other subjects - even by having Latin on the







curriculum there is less time for those other subjects. Mirabile dictu!

40 ACRES OF SCHOOL!

Children at Blanchelande are incredibly fortunate to have such an extensive estate to explore. It's the biggest back garden in Guernsey! A year ago we opened our new nature trail in a breathtaking corner of the valley. Every subject area can utilise this unique resource, whether for scientific research, mathematical measurement or inspiration in Art, English or Music.



BRAND-NEW PRIMARY PLAYGROUND

The playground was formally opened in October by the Lieutenant-Governor. The junior children have loved having this facility upgraded as it can now be used in almost all-weathers. The children's favourites are the giant climbing frame, the swinging bridge and giant chess!







GROWTH

With Blanchelande having an unparalleled natural environment, we take every opportunity to bring the children closer to nature. To deepen their understanding and appreciation for the natural world, this year every primary child is growing their own maize plant.

As you can see, Mr Jenkins, our groundsman, is helping the children plant the young maize into the ground in the walled garden. The children have to remember to give the plants plenty of water so we can see a good result in September!





MICHELIN STANDARDS!

Since Mr Keeling, our chef, arrived in September the demand for our delicious, cooked lunches has rocketed. With the arrival of a brand new commercial kitchen last summer, all food is prepared onsite, using high-quality ingredients. FOSIL INQUIRY PROJECTS

We use the internationally recognised FOSIL framework to develop the skills and attitudes required for independent inquiry systematically and progressively from Reception through to Year 13.

The Year 6 pupils undertake a Signature Work inquiry pupil across Art & Design, English, Computing, Library and Maths leading to a Bronze CREST Award. This culminates in their campaign work where the children take positive action for change within their community. The photos show the children in action last week raising money or awareness for their chosen charities and organisations.







JUNIOR SPORT

The junior children enjoy being active and our PE curriculum ensures they are kept moving as much as possible. Each junior child has just under 2 and a half hours of PE on their timetable each week. On top of this they also take part in the Blanchelande Blast a 15-minute weekly morning exercise session.
